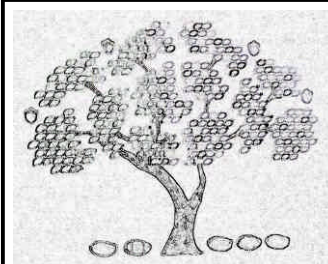

#### Don't React Before You Get The Facts
