The Rabbi's Study

The four questions in the Passover Haggadah begin with what is actually a declaration rather than a question. "Mah Nishtanah" can be translated as follows: "How different this night is from all other nights!" Not only is the night of a Passover seder different from other nights, but there are differences from one home to another, and there may even be differences from the first night to the second night in the same home.

One of our friends in the Boston area once set out a variety of Haggadot (Haggadahs) and had us choose the one we wanted to use so that we could see a variety of approaches to the Pesach seder. My entire collection of Haggadot takes up a good part of one bookshelf in my study. Here is a list of some of them. Please let me know if you use or have used any of these Haggadot in your home!

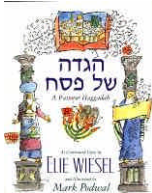

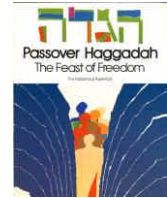
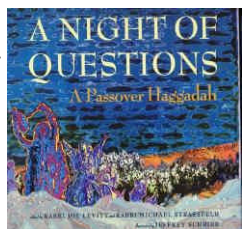

Message from our President, Carole Krassner

Dear Friends,

“Everyone can be great because everyone can serve”. (Martin Luther King, Jr.)

It hardly seems possible that April Fools Day, opening day for baseball and a possible Nor'easter could all occur in the same day. Never a dull moment that's for sure. Also, never a dull moment here at Temple.

We are working very hard to keep our congregation and Temple building together. There was a good attendance at the three congregational meetings that were held, at which everyone had the opportunity to speak and present thoughts and ideas. We are all in this together and it takes more than the board to make things happen. Soon, a letter will be sent out to all congregants that were not able to attend the meetings, asking for your commitment as a temple member. There is also the possibility of another congregational meeting with a summary and update of the meetings. It is important for everyone to be involved.

I'm happy to announce that the land sale was recently approved by the Dover Planning Board. We should have a check in hand by mid May and shortly, we will be receiving a check in the amount of \$20,000 from the Forbes Foundation. That will give us a total of \$200,000 to reduce principal on our mortgage and reduce the payments as well. The developer has also agreed to bring the gas line up to our temple building, which will help keep to reduce our heating bills and to bring up the line for internet, which will help to make our beautiful facility more attractive for rental.

As of this date, almost thirty people have made a pledge to further help reduce our mortgage. We hope to have all pledges in by April 30th and the checks by May 31st. These funds will be put into an escrow account and will not be cashed unless we reach our goal. Every pledge is important, no matter how big or how small. This is a good time to come together as a congregation to show support. Our board is working extremely hard, but we need to have more volunteers to succeed.

It's that time of the year that nominations will be presented to the board. We need new board members. We need you! You can either call the temple office or contact me directly to volunteer. Also, please support our upcoming events. The Art Auction committee has been hard at work for months. It's not too late to buy an add and purchase tickets to the auction to be held on April 16th. We also ask your support for the Nosharama, to be held on May 15th. It's a great opportunity to encourage friends from outside the Jewish Community to sample some delicious Jewish cuisine made by our very own Temple Israel members. We welcome volunteers to set up and serve.

Our Temple Israel Congregational Seder will be held on Saturday, April 23rd at 6:00 p.m. Further information on all of these events in this *Kesher*.

Please don't forget our ongoing Mitzvah Project, providing for the Dover Food Pantry. From our prayerbook, *Mishkan T'filah*-May it be your will, our God and God of our Ancestors that you lead us in peace and help us reach our destination safely, joyfully and peacefully." Chag Pesach Sameach.... Happy Passover!
