**The Rabbi's Study
Remarks at the
Dover Area
Commemoration of the
Birthday of Dr. Martin
Luther King, Jr.
January 16, 2011**

This service tonight comes at a crucial crossroads in our nation's history. The shootings last week in Tucson have raised a variety of issues. It is likely that the extreme rhetoric from the ends of the political spectrum did not directly cause the tragedy last weekend. Yet, the fact that we have refocused attention on our attitudes towards those who disagree with us and the words we use may actually bring us just a little more civility.

When I heard that the Westboro Baptist Church of Topeka, Kansas was planning to picket the funerals in Tucson, I was not surprised. For 12 years, driving to Temple Beth Sholom in Topeka for Sabbath evening Services on Fridays included a glimpse at two signs that were very hurtful – one said, TEMPLE BETH SODOM, and the other bore my last name and a swastika. As far as I am concerned, the incendiary behavior and rhetoric of that group, or any other group that expresses itself in a similar way, deserves a response of silent but firm

action, especially through participation in groups like ours that affirm that we are connected by and within the Oneness that unites the universe. My years of serving in Topeka on the board of the Brown Foundation, set up by the family of Oliver Brown of the Brown vs. Board case for school desegregation, reminded me how far we have come and how much work is left to be done – work that can be achieved through honest partnership, but not by extremism.

Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. said of the world in which he lived: "We live now in extreme times. The question is not whether we will be extremists, but what kind of extremists we will be. Will we be extremists for hate or for love?"

We know all too well what happens when extremists for hate put their opinions into action. There are, at least, hurtful words that perpetuate horrific stereotypes. There are, further, policies that produce prejudice. There are proclamations intended to protect personal positions of power. There are, finally, destructive acts that lead to devastating injury or even death.

We also know what can happen when extremists for love put their beliefs into action. They reject expression of hate and use words to heal. They may criticize and protest, but they do so to break down barriers built on bigotry. Extremists for love may assertively advocate policies of their own, but they do so to strike a balance among all of us, no matter what our class, race, religion or cultural background. Extremists for love would include in their circle of humanity not

only those who are like them, but all people, even those who would oppose their openness and their desire to support and to share. Dr. King saw the importance of sharing not only in our nation but throughout our world. He once declared, "We have inherited a large house, a great 'world house' in which we have to live together – Black and White, Easterner and Westerner, Gentile and Jew, Catholic and Protestant – Muslim and Hindu – a family unduly separated in ideas, cultures and interests, who, because we can never again live apart, must learn somehow to live with each other in peace."

We are different, but we are here – together – in this community, in this nation, in this world, in this human family. Let us cooperate in this great house to finally – somehow – learn to live with each other in unity, in equality, and in peace. And let us say Amen.

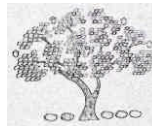

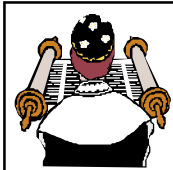

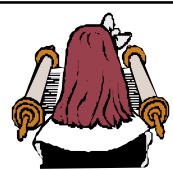
